Page 1a

One and Two Syllable Words

There are a number of double syllable words - 'mar-ket', 'vill-age', 'push-ed'. Continue as discussed in Story 21.

Phonic Decoding

Explain how 'car', 'far' share a common Sound of '..ar'

Whole Words: 'was', 'said'

Long Vowel: 'i' as in 'pie' | 'i' as in 'sigh'
Carefully Explain: 'would', 'too' (we will come back to "would")

Pa Ma car jar far market village pushed




Pa had a funny old car.

At the village market, Ma got fresh figs in a jar.




Pa pushed a fat piglet into the car.
